Presentation by Phil Weinrich on trees available for the Linda Rosenbaum Tree-give-away on Oct 7 at Believer's Church.

Phil's presentation included information on the migratory birds and native trees and plants that attract them. Trees available include:
Black Ironwood, Crabwood, Dahoon Holly, Gumbo Limbo, Jamaica Caper, Marlberry, Pigeon Plum, Red Bay, Simpson's Stopper, Spanish Stopper, West Indian Cherry, and Willow Busic.

Members signed up for trees and Phil had already received many e-mails requesting trees. New membership has increased.

The next speaker, Bob Haehle was from the Sun Sentinel. He reminded us to give good care to the trees we receive in the Give-Away, as there will not be as much rain in the winter. Allow 10-15 feet for root structure of most trees. Mr. Haehle relayed stories about planting things that do not always work. What trees have a fragrance - Jamaica Caper and Simpson Stopper. Another aromatic plant is the Fiddlewood, but they do get eaten by caterpillars. Little Gem Magnolia or Sweet Magnolia are fragrant. Do not plant anything too close to the house and know how big it gets. Palm fertilizer could be given to everything in March, June and October. Other questions were addressed.
